Hints and Tips For Clubs This Month



- All individuals on poolside at club events must be members of the club. Even if they are helping set up on behalf of the club, Covid Liasion, or running the raffle, they must all be members.
- If a volunteer is helping look after swimmers on poolside (in a noncoaching capacity), they are Team Managers and should undertake the appropriate training to do so. They are not poolside helpers.

• If ever there was an accident/ incident at your club and a claim/ investigation was made, the risk assessment will be requested from the insurance company for that event. Please make sure you have these in place. The Region can help provide templates and support, but the contents will be down to the club.
